#### **Kurt and Eli Zniewski**


"My son Eli and I, worked on a wood duck house. We found a bird house book from the dusty shelves.

### **Charlie Gunderson**

"Just completed and delivered a gun cabinet; I haven't made one of these for about 20 years."

Made with cherry hardwood and veneer. Size 76" tall, 32" wide, 21" deep at base, top 11 ½" deep. Holds 9-guns (two DBL spots). Can display pistols in slat front area.

#### **Glenn Street**

"I recently designed and made this hard maple crib and dresser set for a new grandson. To ensure safety, the crib sides are stationary and the spacing between spindles is <2.625". Both pieces were stained with steel wool dissolved in vinegar. The crib can be disassembled to get it through narrow doorways and convert it to a bed as the child outgrows the crib—Festool DF500 connectors were used. Mattress height is adjustable. The hand-dovetailed crib and dresser inset drawers are mounted on soft close slides. A long narrow bin behind the crib drawers stores unused spindles and/or safety guards."
