#### <u>Open Shop</u>



**Don Peterson** showed a lovely "brush" box he created out of white oak. He made mitered dovetails.





John Wilson showed a blanket ladder he created out of red oak. It gets used for guests and also for Christmas decorations!

John Caye brought in a bent-wood frame for a fishing net he'd made. He described his bending process and explained why airdried rather than kiln-dried wood is necessary for successful bending in this project.

# WOODTURNING WITH GUY SHAFER



The March meeting featured a demonstration by Guy Shafer introducing members to woodturning. Guy gave a brief overview of the wood lathe suggesting that beginning turners should immediately consider a variable speed lathe. He also added that a keyless Jacob's Chuck should be used for turning small items. There are six basic turning tools, and experienced turners prefer high speed steel tools over carbide tipped tools. An adequate starter lathe can be purchased for \$700-\$800.

Guy began the demonstration by sharpening some steel turning chisels and gouges.

He incorporated turning safety into his demonstration of turning a bottle stopper and a wooden top. One of Guy's top tips is: "Always cut downhill". He mentioned the ABCs of turning, meaning, "<u>Anchor Bevel and Cut</u>"





Guy is a member of the Mid Minnesota Association of Woodturners. The MMAW is frequently offering classes through the Paramount and are always willing to share their knowledge and skill with the CMWA members.

### Build a Miter Fold & Veneered Box with Bob Van Dyke- 3 days

October <u>24, 25, & 26</u>, 2022 Instructor—Bob VanDyke Fee: \$450 + materials

If you have ever done any re-sawing then you know how cool a book matched panel can be. When you incorporate veneers into your work the possibilities for creating spectacular patterns are almost endless! Bookmatching is the simple one- but what about radial matching or "book & butt"? In this hands-on class students will each make a small "Miter Fold" box out of walnut and while doing that we will explore the endless possibilities of working with veneer to create a striking top for the box.



### Making Tablesaw Jigs & Fixtures with Bob Van Dyke-3 days

October <u>27, 28, & 29</u>, 2022

#### Instructor—Bob VanDyke Fee: \$450 + materials

The idea of making jigs and fixtures for the tablesaw is always one that creates a lot of debate. Some people insist that they are not worth it and "just do it by hand" while other people love coming up with intricate fixtures that do a specific job really well. Bob's approach is somewhere in the middle- will the jig be useful enough to be used over & over again and is it better than one that can be easily purchased? This class is Not a beginning tablesaw class.



Participants must have some working experience with tablesaws & routers. Note: because of the design of the jigs for the table saw you must have a table saw with a Biessemeyer type fence (i.e., Sawstop, Jet, Powermatic). Bench top or "Job site" saws will not work with these jigs. Specify type of saw you own when registering.
