Devin Middendorf shared a lantern he is developing for an upcoming wedding. It is made of oak. He discussed joinery options.




Mark Voigt demonstrated a portable workbench that provides a solid worksurface but folds up for easy transport.

Kurt Zniewski and Shawn Jarvis were our presenters at the January meeting. The meetings this year are a series that cover a project from beginning to end. The "project" is the simple box in all its forms. This month the topic was *The Start*.

First we have to decide what to make. Questions to answer include: who is it for, do I have plans or pictures, do I know dimensions, did I choose the project or did it choose me, is it going to be fun, or do you have reservations.

Once we know what we want to make the next considerations include: do I have the skills, the tools, the materials, money for the tools and materials, the time, the space, a home for the finished piece. If the answer to any of these is no, the project may not be successful.

If we are trying new techniques we will need to find instruction or help. We can look at books, magazines, the internet, or ask friends.

Answering all these questions will help insure a successful project.

Challenge—Build something and bring it to the next meeting. Explain how you started the project and answered some of the questions we discussed.

Mike Siemsen Toolmaking Class

The CMWA hosted a two day toolmaking class with Mike Siemsen January 20 and 21. The class made a Moxon vise, a marking knife, a knife type marking gauge, and a mallet. The tools were all made using hand tools. Students learned to tap and cut threads for the vise, chop several mortices by hand, turn a handle for the marking knife, glue up and shape the mallet, and harden and sharpen the stell for the marking knife and gauge. Everyone finished their projects.
