February 2024 Field Trip to Saint John's

Our regular February meeting was a field trip to Saint John's new woodworking facility, home to Saint John's Abbey Woodworking and Abbey Organ Builders. We were fortunate to have the organ builder, Martin Pasi, as our tour guide. The hundreds of parts required to build an organ are all made on site. The craftsmanship and skill set to make everything -- from the metal pipes, wooden pipes, internal mechanisms, keyboards, and countless other parts -- is breathtaking. The tin and lead metals for the pipes are smelted and poured into sheets on site, then precisely shaped to make the organ pipes. The woodworking crafts range from the structural elements of the organ, to carving and fine woodworking for the casework.

It is a very impressive facility. Thanks to Michael Roske, Mike Ross, Fr. Lew, and our guide Martin Pasi for a very thorough and interesting tour.

Make a Dovetailed Tea Chest with Michael Pekovich

October 21 through 25, 9am to 4pm

rience needed.

Sharing a cup of tea with friends is a nice way to spend an afternoon or end a meal. The experience is made even better by serving up tea selections in a handmade chest. This useful and quietly elegant chest offers a variety of woodworking challenges in a small project. You can put the skills you'll learn in this class to use on any number of other projects as well. The class will cover tips for fast, accurate dovetails when building the case. Mitered liners are a powerful solution when dividing a space



for contents. You'll learn how to fine-tune the fit of miters with a hand plane for seamless joints. You'll also come away with a novel strategy for adding a lid to a box. The lid hinges open and slides side-to-side to reveal the contents without having to remove it. Kumiko panels decorate the lid and wound-cord handles finish off the chest.

- Break up space with mitered partitions
- Create tight-fitting miters with a hand plane
- Build and fit a hinged sliding door
- Make kumiko panels
- Create hand-wound hemp cord handles


