Greetings Woodworkers

At our November meeting we had a guest speaker from Osmo Finishes. He told us all about the many different products his company offers, both interior and exterior finishes. Their products are made from rapidly renewable, natural vegetable oils; Osmo is an environmentally friendly alternative to other wood finishes. Unlike a common polyurethane Osmo Polyx Oils do not form a thick film that cannot be repaired, it both soaks in and forms a microporous surface; protecting the wood from outside and in. For more information about Osmo you can visit their website at osmocolorusa.com. They have many data sheets available there that allow you to learn exactly how to apply one of their finishes to your project.

Our next meeting will be held on November 20 and we will be having our annual safety meeting. Safety is one of those things that we can never learn too much about.
