Bent Lamination Demo—April 17th Meeting

There are several methods to bend wood: steam bending, bending plywood, kerf bending and bent laminations. I will be discussing and demonstrating bent laminations, including when to bend and when to band saw to shape.

We will talk about form design and building, material selection and preparation. Oh no I've got snipe and what to do. What glues are used flexible (PVA) or ridged. How many clamps?

I will bring several examples and we will glue up one piece.

March Meeting Recap

The March meeting was a <u>presentation by the Avon Hills Folk</u> <u>School</u> (video) Timber Framing Group.

Chris Schellinger gave a little history of the Folk School and outlined some of the structures they had built, then turned the meeting over to Clark Bremer, the primary instructor in timber framing. Clark has had 20+ years in timber framing.

He started by indicating that they use white pine as the primary beam material due to its stability and "lighter" weight. He then talked about the use of mortise-tenon joinery in the construction due to that joint's strength. The structures rely on compression to hold the joint together, while the design seeks to minimize tension when possible. He described the difference between a



normal shop chisel and the slick used in timber framing. He then demonstrated cutting the mortise using drills to hog out the rough mortise and then cleaning up with chisels. He used three different drills, describing the differences between the drills and the actual bits used with each type of drill.

- Beam Auger Drill
- Timber Frame Beam Boring Machine
- Chain Mortiser

He didn't make the tenon to fit into the mortise, but he did break out a large 16" circular saw that was used for the making of the tenon.

Show and Tell Continued Bandage Roller

Purpose: Glenn Street designed and built about 10 of these devices several years ago for a group of women that roll l000's of bandages each year. These are sent to underdeveloped countries in communities that have no health care facilities.

Bandage Rolling Procedure:

- White sheets are ripped into long strips.
- Roller is clamped to the edge of a table.
- The end of the strip is placed in the spindle's slot.
- The bandage is rolled by spinning the handle.
- Once rolled, it is slid off the spindle

The volunteers are always looking for white sheets. If you would like to donate any white sheets or get involved in rolling bandages, feel free to contact Judy Ampe at 320-259-5828.

Baptismal Box (Salem Lutheran Church)

Purpose: Given to a family for storing their child's baptismal certificate, candle and quilt.

Materials:

- 1/2" thick hard maple sides
- 1/2" thick plywood, hard maple banded-top. <u>Thanks</u> to Eddie Och for donating the plywood scraps used in the tops.
- <u>3/16" thick plywood floor</u>
- A lap joint is used at each corner and reinforced with splines.

Finish: Stain free with clear catalyzed lacquer
