January's meeting topic: Clamping

Tom Doom and Tom Homan combined to provide the group with an overview of clamping tools and techniques. It was apparent that they had put a great deal of work into the program.

Dozens of different kinds of clamps were discussed. One that was particularly interesting was the wedge edge clamp which Tom Homan is discussing (top photo). Many of us have used the three way screw type edge clamps only to watch to clamps on the board faces slip as the edge clamp is tightened. The face clamps on this clamp exert more pressure as the edge is tightened. The face cams are padded to prevent the denting of wood commonly experienced with the three way screw clamps. Clamping pads can be used with the three way clamps to prevent denting if necessary. Tom uses felt pads, cork or small pieces of plywood for clamping pads.

The cabinet claw clamp which Tom Doom is discussing in the (bottom photo) is used to align mating cabinets.

There were a number of non-traditional clamping methods presented: Tape, rubber bands, innertubes, etc...The use of wax paper and tape as tools to prevent squeeze out from spreading onto a project is very helpful.

When clamping projects that are to large for normal clamps to reach in from the edge (ie: table tops), they use cawls or an easy and inexpensive adaptation to a pipe clamp. The adaptations are simple wood extensions made from 2x4's with holes drilled in them the same diameter as the pipe. The extensions slide on the pipe between the two clamp faces.

Other uses for clamps were also presented. There are clamping straight edges for marking or cutting guides, clamps that turn into spreaders, jack clamps used for cabinet installation, clamps that are intended for squaring and positioning and many more.

Everyone learned something from this presentation. Thanks to the two Toms for putting together a great show.

The February meeting topic will be on the use of the Leigh dovetail jig and will be presented by John Caye.




